It's not just Lyme.

Ticks can carry multiple pathogens and transmit them all in the same bite. For instance, Tick-Borne Relapsing Fever is very similar to Lyme and must be considered when testing.

## **TIP #4 CONSIDER**TESTING YOUR PET

Dogs, cats, and other furry friends can and do get tick-borne illnesses. In fact, there are three times as many cases of Lyme disease in dogs as there are in humans. And, since ticks and fleas can easily migrate from pets to human owners, your pets' health is intimately linked with your family's health.

### TIP #5 SAVE THE TICK

If possible, save the tick, dead or alive, in a plastic bag or tube. The tick can be tested at a lab for infections from a variety of pathogens. This can be easier than getting testing for yourself.
